Presenter Bios

Sheila Caguiat serves as the Executive Director of the Danielle Dawn Smalley Foundation. She develops and enhances the organization's pipeline safety programs by working with school officials, pipeline companies, and regulatory agencies across the United States. She has personally delivered pipeline safety education to school officials in nearly 40 states, in partnership with numerous pipeline operators. As a non-profit professional, Sheila has nearly 20 years of experience working with tribal, faith-based, public, and private non-profit organizations, many of which have focused on safety and prevention programming.

Alexandra Copeland is a School Safety Specialist with the Texas School Safety Center. She is a Level II Trainer for the Yellow Ribbon Suicide Prevention Program, a Certified QPR Gatekeeper Instructor, a Certified C.A.L.M. Instructor, and a member of the Texas Suicide Prevention Council. Alexandra continues to work with diverse populations, including underprivileged, underrepresented, immigrant/ refugee, LGBTQ, and special needs persons, from K-adult age. She avidly works with members of the school community to provide training and resources on suicide prevention, mental health, substance abuse, diversity/cultural awareness, and interpersonal violence topics.

Elizabeth Garza serves as an Educational Consultant for the Region 18 Education Service Center. Previously, she worked in investigations and as a forensic interviewer. For the last nine years, Elizabeth has researched safety issues and presented to audiences of students, teachers, and administrators not only on school safety, but also on the topics of bully prevention, internet safety, dating violence, suicide prevention, conflict resolution, and emergency operations planning. After serving her country for eight years in the Army, Elizabeth completed her Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminology followed by a Master of Public Administration and Leadership.

Mallory Myers is an Assistant Attorney General with the Office of the Attorney General of Texas. She is a member of the newly formed Human Trafficking and Transnational/Organized Crime Section within the Criminal Prosecutions Division. Mallory is passionate about raising awareness and increasing prevention efforts to combat the sex and labor trafficking industry in Texas. She is a former prosecutor with the Bexar County District Attorney's Office, where she worked in the Criminal Trial Division and the Human Trafficking Unit.
